This course will begin with plant selection criteria (aesthetics, site adaptability, maintenance and sustainability) and the functions that plants serve both within plant compositions and in the overall landscape. Exercises will focus on enhancing our plant palette and the way we think about plant use.

The course will then focus on the landscape design process. Topics will include landscape character, design intent, design principles and organization of space. Detailed discussions will include client interaction, site analysis and simple techniques for developing creative designs. Classroom exercises will reinforce the design basics and landscape plan preparation.
