Dear Governor Whitmer:

As the national and state trade organizations representing America's and the Michigan's horticultural industry, we write to respectfully urge swift action to enable Michigan's independent garden retailers to resume business operations consistent with federal and state health and safety guidelines to protect workers and customers. These mostly small and family businesses are a critical link between your state's greenhouse and nursery crop growers, which are properly recognized as agriculture and therefore critical infrastructure, and your consumers.

These businesses' very survival is in jeopardy as the short season for peak demand for plants and supplies is upon us. Please consider the following rationale for enabling them to operate, at least in limited fashion, to serve the people of Michigan:

- Garden retailers constitute the last link in our industry's supply chain, the link that puts essential products grown by greenhouse and nursery farmers into the hands of consumers. These products include vegetable, fruit-producing, and other plants, seeds, tools, and essential supplies.
- Millions of Americans already engage in home food production, which contributes to community resilience. Many more wish to do so now. All need access to plants and supplies provided by garden-oriented retailers. As consumers remain at home under official state or local orders, home gardening is one of the healthiest ways they can spend time. Residents need ways to access plants and supplies while supporting their local business community.
- Independent garden retailers are typically locally-based businesses, sourcing from mostly local suppliers. They tend to have the best handle on which varieties work in local areas because they, too, are local.
- Independent garden retailers in Michigan are enduring a grave injustice, generally being prevented from sustaining even limited operations while corporate mass-retailers are being allowed to operate. Garden-focused independent retailers are often in a better position to innovate to serve customers via strategies like online or telephonic ordering, home deliveries, or order assembly for "curbside" pickup. Independent garden retailers are often better able to manage customers onsite, limiting numbers and ensuring social



distancing, than are mass retailers. Most merchandising and shopping happen out-of-doors, in fresh air.

 Considering that locally-based garden retail businesses see 60- to 80-percent of their annual sales occurring in an eight week window in the Spring, this is the critical period in which even limited operations will help to enable these businesses to survive.

We are monitoring the situation on a national basis, and Michigan is one of only a few states precluding operations by garden-focused retailers. Most states are enabling at least some operations. Garden-focused retailers should be treated with equity relative to mass-merchandiser garden centers, and farm markets. We and the industry we serve fully understand and embrace the imperative of adhering to the health and safety guidance coming from the Centers for Disease Control and state/local health authorities. Protection of employees and customers are essential priorities.

This said, we believe that garden-focused retail businesses that are in a position to innovate to serve their customers consistent with health and safety guidelines should be allowed to do so. We respectfully urge timely consideration and action to recognize these businesses as essential and enable them to operate. Please feel welcome to contact us if we may provide further insights.
